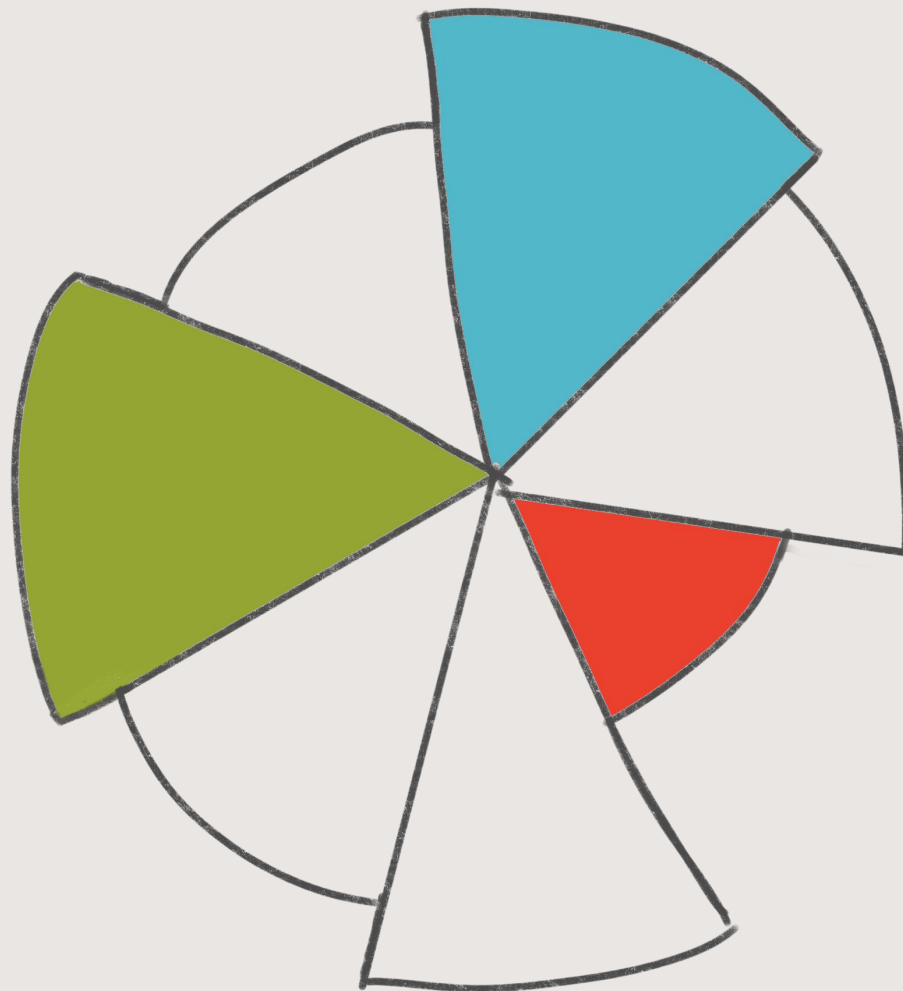

Introduction

Welcome to our inaugural impact report. As UK Architects Declare celebrates five years of action and activism, we are proud to share some of our achievements with you, our signatories, supporters and the wider built environment community.

Launched in May 2019, we were the first declaration under the umbrella of what soon became Built Environment Declares, a global network with 40 declarations across 28 countries, with more than 8,200 signatories between us. Across the UK, more than 1,370 practices have made their declaration with us. 30 volunteers have served on our Steering Group since 2019, and in 2024 alone SG members donated more than 2,700 hours to our work.

How do we work for change?

Architects Declare is many things: a declaration, a programme, a network, a charity, a critical friend, and a partner for change.

Our dual approach has a common focus on building agency and delivering change:

1. Supporting and encouraging our signatories on pathways to deliver their declaration.
2. Demonstrating where leaders can change the systems behind the crisis: to move us away from degenerative 'business-as-usual', beyond 'sustainability' and towards fully regenerative solutions.

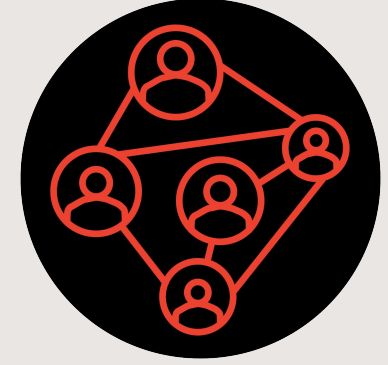

Registered as a CIO, formalising AD's work for the public benefit.

Parliamentary launch of manifesto for impactful policies, with MPs, Peers and industry experts.

Regenerative Architecture Index
Launched with Architecture Today to benchmark architect's progress on regenerative practices and projects.

Regenerative Design Primer
Launched to help architects lead a transition to positive outcomes for people, planet and nature.



2023

Meet the Steering Group
First of a series of quarterly, short online meetings for signatories to explore topics of their choice with SG members.

2023 was also a year of focus on developing **Our Plan for Change** and the foundations for each of the major activities we launched in 2024.

We recruited a part-time communications officer to support the Steering Group and our part-time manager (recruited in 2021).



2022

Designing Your Own Practice Roadmap + Practice Action Masterclasses
Series of events with ACAN and supported by RIBA, focused on key topics in our Practice Guide. Available as videos.

Building Justice: Crisis Solutions
Special in-person and live-streamed event as world leaders gathered for the COP27 talks.



2021

Ideas into Action
Online 2-day conference focused on how to put bold ideas into practice.

Built for the Environment Report & Summit
Worked with RIBA to research and publish report ahead of COP26 in Glasgow.

Practice Guide
Launched to help signatories act on their declarations.



2020

Architects Declare: One Year On
In our survey, 80% of signatories said that joining AD affected their organisation and how they approached projects.

Regional events
Collaborated with Built Environment Declares to hold 19 online regional events over 10 months.

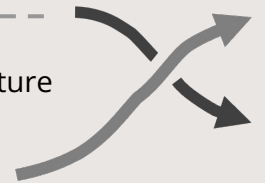

Your Impact Stories

A top priority for us is supporting our signatories to advance a just transition to regenerative design and enabling change within their practices and projects and across the industry.

To identify whether we are meeting practices' needs and expectations, we will undertake an annual survey of signatories to highlight any gaps, as well as evidencing impact.

The majority of signatories surveyed this year say their practice has changed since becoming an AD signatory.

We also regularly canvas signatories for feedback and to inspire ideas for future activities. Our quarterly online Meet the Steering Group sessions are an opportunity for signatories to bring their questions and ideas.

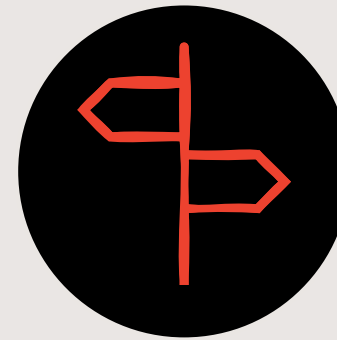

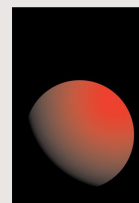
We'd love to hear more of your stories about how Architects Declare has supported your practice's work; please do get in touch.
