

Early adoption policies for the next government

1 Make the Future Homes/ Building Standard fit for purpose:

- Align with the industry backed metrics and reporting processes of the Net Zero Carbon Buildings Standard.
- Legislate the reporting and limiting of embodied carbon. Refer to cross-industry Policy Position Paper.

2 Incentivise retrofit and circularity:

- Align financial incentives to prioritise retrofit.
- Establish material banks and material passporting nationally.

3 Ensure a just and green transition:

• Create a nationwide green jobs strategy to utilise the construction sector's national reach in green job creation.

The Foundations needed to support the building blocks to succeed long-term:

- Provide climate literacy at a national scale.
- Align the economy with well-being and planetary limits.
- Safeguard future generations' ability to act.
- Foster climate leadership through reforms and working with local authorities.
